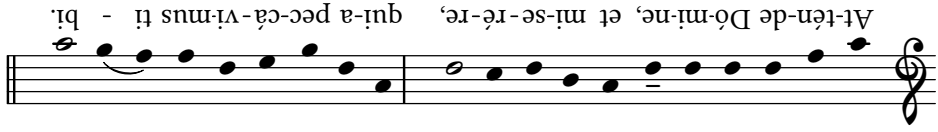


FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

INTROIT

V. Innocens captus, nec repugnans ductus: testibus falsis pro impiis damnatus: quos redemisti, tu conserva, Christe.

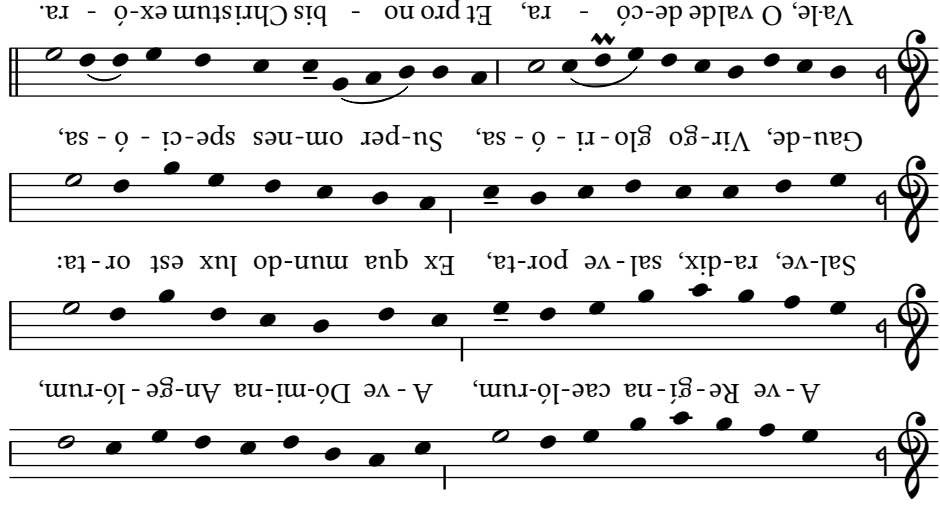

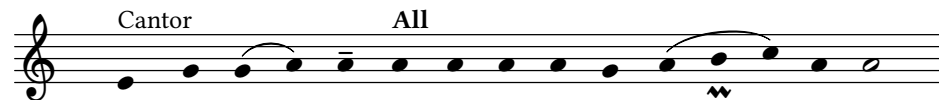
